I am honored to be nominated to run for President of the Southern Sociological Society. I have been a member of the SSS since I was an undergraduate at the University of Tulsa in 1987, and I have benefitted immensely from my participation in our society. Regional associations are extremely important for both developing scholars and established researchers, and I have always been a strong advocate of the SSS. For us, particularly those of us in the South and/or from the South the SSS is even more. Especially in these times of political uncertainty, sociologists must play a strong role in continuing to research issues related to inequalities in the South—and how the distinctive history of the South plays a role in reproducing these inequalities.
