

The Department of Sociology at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte is seeking applications for a one-year, Visiting Lecturer position, non-tenure track appointment, to begin August 15, 2016. Requirements for this position include 1) MA or higher in Sociology; 2) evidence of excellence in teaching; and 3) a commitment to teaching in a diverse environment. This position entails a 4-4 teaching load. We expect candidates to teach Introduction to Sociology along with other courses that will meet departmental needs.

The department offers the B.A. and M.A. in Sociology. Departmental faculty contribute to the liberal studies curriculum, and we support interdisciplinary programs in Gerontology, Women and Gender Studies, International Studies, Latin American Studies, and American Studies.
