

The Department of Sociology at the University of Tennessee-Knoxville invites applications for a tenure-track Assistant Professor with expertise in quantitative methods, beginning August 1, 2017. Specifically, we seek a scholar with expertise sufficient to train graduate students in one or more of the following: generalized linear models, structural equation modeling, spatial analysis, network analysis, hierarchical modeling, and big data analysis. Applicants will be expected to teach regression techniques at the doctoral level. We are particularly interested in candidates who can contribute to the Department's strength in social justice (<http://web.utk.edu/~utsocdep/>) and whose research resonates with our other departmental areas of globalization/political economy, critical race and ethnic studies, and/or environmental sociology. Applicants must demonstrate promise of distinguished scholarship and excellent teaching and will be expected to seek external funding as a condition of tenure. UT is part of the consortium that comprises the Atlanta Research Data Center, so experience working in an RDC is useful. A PhD in Sociology or related areas is required at the time of appointment. Our department offers a supportive and collegial atmosphere in which scholars make a variety of important contributions to academic research, teaching, and public sociology.
