We are seeking a criminologist in the areas of corrections and/or community corrections. Preference would be given to candidates whose work focuses on issues related to correctional policy and practice, rehabilitation/desistence from crime, community reentry, and corrections and public safety. Research interests which hold potential for community involvement in local or state corrections and criminal justice systems are welcome. Candidates are expected to have a Ph.D. in Sociology, Criminology, Criminal Justice or a related discipline from an accredited university by [August 2017](#), a research agenda, and some teaching experience.

Required materials include a letter, curriculum vitae, evidence of teaching effectiveness (e.g., copies or summaries of student evaluations or faculty evaluations), and the names and contact information for at least three references.
