

About the University of Houston-Downtown

The University of Houston-Downtown is a comprehensive four-year university offering bachelor's and selected master's degree programs and providing strong academic and career preparation as well as life-long learning opportunities. Located in the heart of the city, the University reflects the diversity of the Greater Houston Metropolitan Area, and, through its academic programs, engages with the community to address the needs and advance the development of the region. UHD is an inclusive community dedicated to integrating teaching, service, and scholarly research to develop students' talents and prepare them for success in a dynamic global society. UHD draws students from throughout the Greater Houston area. UHD is considered one of the most ethnically diverse liberal arts institutions in the southwest, a distinction that indicates the student body accurately reflects the Houston community's wealth of cultures, languages and nationalities. The University offers all students a specially tailored opportunity for quality higher education, as well as small classes. UHD employs over 1,400 faculty and staff.

Since opening its doors in 1974, UHD has grown in mission and service, and now offers baccalaureate degrees in 44 areas and eight master's degree programs. Over 14,000 students attend classes in five Colleges: Business, Humanities and Social Sciences, Public Service and Sciences and Technology, as well as University College, which serves as the entry point for all students coming to UHD. Approximately 2,000 students graduate each year with degrees in humanities and the arts, social sciences, business, the sciences and technology, education and criminal justice. As one of the four distinct and separate components of the University of Houston System, UHD offers educational opportunities and access to students from a variety of backgrounds, including many first-generation college students, students who work full- or part-time, students with additional family obligations, and students who transfer from community colleges and other higher education institutions. Job Description:

The Sociology Program in the Department of Social Sciences at the University of Houston-Downtown seeks to hire a Lecturer in Sociology beginning Spring 2017. This is a one-year, non-tenure track position, renewable based on performance and departmental need. Area of specialization is open; areas of teaching competence must include at least two of the following: Aggression and Violence, Deviance, Gender, Minorities, Social Inequality, Statistics, and Research Methods. Secondary areas of interest in Health and Behavioral Science and Critical Race Studies are especially welcome. The position has a 5/5 teaching load consisting of a mix of lower- and upper-level sociology courses including Introduction to Sociology, with a salary of \$42,000/year (plus benefits). Excellence in undergraduate teaching is essential. Ph.D. in Sociology by time of appointment is preferred, but ABDs will be considered.

The Sociology Program at UHD consists of six tenure-track/tenured faculty members and multiple adjunct professors situated in a multidisciplinary Department of Social Sciences serving

a diverse nontraditional student body. It is an undergraduate degree-granting program with a minor and major in Sociology and general education/core curriculum teaching responsibilities.

Requirements

Ph.D. in Sociology by time of appointment is preferred, but ABDs will be considered.
