The successful candidate will be expected to teach and conduct research within their area of expertise, assist with advising Sociology majors, provide service to the department, college and/or university and assist with other duties as assigned. Qualifications require an earned Ph.D. in Sociology and teaching experience. Applicants who demonstrate a strong record of or potential for publication and securing grants or other extramural funding preferred. Successful candidates must be committed to working effectively with diverse student populations. Applicants are expected to describe their commitment to fostering a diverse educational environment through their research, teaching, and/or service activities. Founded in 1898 the University of Louisiana at Lafayette is a public research university with high research activity. The university is the largest member of the University of Louisiana System that consists of nine institutions. The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges accredits the university. The university offers degree programs in 55 undergraduate subjects, 15 post bachelor certificates, seven graduate certificates, the master's degree in 28 disciplines, and the doctorate in 10 disciplines.
