The position will primarily support the department by offering a mixture of online and face-to-face courses at the upper and lower levels, as needed by the department. KSU uses the "Quality Matters" certification process for online courses and instructors. The teaching load is nine 3-credit hour courses over the academic year (fall and spring semesters).
