

Virginia Tech invites applications for one full-time, nine-month, non-tenure-track instructor position in the Department of Sociology for the 2017-2018 academic year. Teaching load will be four courses each semester. Applicants must have teaching experience and be able to teach a variety of sociology courses including “Introductory Sociology,” “Race, Class, Gender & Sexualities,” and “Schools, Violence & Justice.” Applicants must have Ph.D. in sociology in hand at the start of appointment.

The Department of Sociology grants the B.S., M.S., and Ph.D. degrees in sociology with options in Africana Studies or Women’s and Gender Studies. We also offer an undergraduate major in criminology. The Department of Sociology is the academic home of programs in Africana Studies, American Indian Studies, and Women’s and Gender Studies, and houses the Center for Race and Social Policy Research and the Center for Peace Studies and Violence Prevention.
