

ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF SOCIOLOGY: The Winthrop University Department of Sociology, Criminology, and Anthropology invites applications for a tenure-track position beginning August 2018. The successful candidate will have an active research agenda and be able to teach a variety of courses in a combined sociology program, including courses within the criminology concentration, and core sociology courses such as statistics or quantitative research methods. He or she will also demonstrate potential for research involving undergraduate collaborators. Ability to teach in the area of gender, sexuality, race and ethnicity, theory, or family is a plus. Requirements include a Ph.D. by August 2018, evidence of successful teaching experience and commitment to student learning, and evidence of an ongoing program of research and publication. The diverse department supports a thriving B.A. program in sociology with concentrations in criminology and anthropology. Winthrop, a small public comprehensive university boasts a diverse student body of 5,000 undergraduates and was recently ranked second nationally in an Education Trust report for its success in graduating students in minority populations. The beautiful tree-lined campus is located in Rock Hill, South Carolina, and area with abundant recreational opportunities including kayaking, biking clubs and facilities, a tennis center, several golf courses, and many parks.
