

The Department of Sociology at Loyola University New Orleans invites applications for a tenure-track assistant professor position to begin August 2018. A Ph.D. in Sociology is required by the time of hire. The Department of Sociology offers a BA in Sociology with optional concentrations in three areas: Global Sociology; Stratification and Inequality; and Crime, Law, and Social Control. The Department of Sociology also contributes courses to a number of interdisciplinary minors, including Environmental Studies, Women's Studies, African and African-American Studies, Latin American Studies, Legal Studies, and New Orleans Studies.

Research specialties are open. In addition to teaching responsibilities (3-3 course load), colleagues are expected to advise undergraduate students, participate in department, college, and university committees, and maintain active involvement in scholarly activities, including publication and securing outside funding. Candidates must be committed to excellence in undergraduate liberal arts education. The department has a strong commitment to teaching students to think critically about social justice principles and their realization in the community.

Loyola University, situated in uptown New Orleans, is a Jesuit university known for its academic excellence, its commitment to social justice and community service as well as its commitment to Affirmative Action/Equal Opportunity Employment. Loyola University New Orleans welcomes applications from women and minority candidates. Salary and benefits are competitive. Applicants must submit a letter describing their teaching and research interests with a brief statement of their personal education philosophy, a current Curriculum Vitae, three letters of recommendation (to be sent directly by the referees), an official transcript, samples of scholarship, samples of course syllabi, and evidence of teaching success (e.g., evaluations).
