Position/Rank and Salary: The Department of Sociology and Criminology at the University of Arkansas invites applications for a tenure-track position in sociology, at the rank of Assistant Professor, to begin August 2018. Salary is very competitive, with typical teaching load of two courses per semester. The University of Arkansas is a Carnegie RU/H research institution, with an enrollment of over 27,000 students. Nestled in the foothills of the Ozark Mountains, Fayetteville is a rapidly growing city in the Northwest Arkansas corridor that is consistently rated among the top places to live and work in the U.S.

Qualifications: A Ph.D. in sociology, or related social science discipline at the time of appointment is required. We are seeking candidates with an active research agenda, evidence of scholarly productivity, and a commitment to exceptional teaching. Successful applicants' scholarship will be in the area of social inequalities, broadly defined. Candidates who can contribute qualitative, quantitative or mixed methods expertise to the department's newly developed certificate program in social science data analytics are preferred, as are candidates who can contribute to a burgeoning area in health and wellbeing. Applicants with research that adds to departmental and research center strengths in the areas of community or crime will be considered a plus.
