TENNESSEE TECH UNIVERSITY invites applicants for a full-time, nine-month, tenure-track position in Sociology at the rank of Assistant Professor, to begin August 1, 2018. A Ph.D. from an accredited institution in Criminology, Criminal Justice, or Sociology is required by the start date (August 1, 2018). Expertise in criminology and criminal justice is preferred, but all specialties will be considered.

The department seeks applicants to teach introductory and upper-division courses in criminology and criminal justice, compatible with departmental needs. Teaching experience is preferred. Research and scholarship is required, as well as service to the department and university. The candidate must have a research agenda, demonstrate a commitment to the continued improvement of teaching using research-based practices, demonstrate collegiality and cooperation within the department, college, and university, and be willing to teach online courses.
