

TEACHING ASSISTANT PROFESSOR POSITION

The Department of Sociology at UNC-Chapel Hill is seeking to hire a Teaching Assistant Professor. This is a two-year fixed term position with a 3-3 a teaching load. Successful candidates should have a record of outstanding teaching and will be expected to teach a mix of lower and upper division undergraduate courses.

We seek a faculty member who can contribute to one or more areas of department instructional needs: lower level courses (e.g., Intro/Sociological Perspectives, Race and Ethnic Relations) and those that meet the requirements for our major in Management and Society (e.g., Stratifications, Organizations, Economic Sociology), minor in Social and Economic Justice, and/or our new minor in Health and Society (e.g., U.S. Population Health). There is flexibility in the specific courses, depending on an instructor's interest and background. Applicants should submit a letter of application indicating their teaching and research interests, a curriculum vitae, a teaching portfolio that includes a statement of their pedagogical approach, and course materials (syllabi, student evaluations), and the names and contact information for three references.
