

VISITING FACULTY POSITION IN SOCIOLOGY

The department seeks a generalist with a strong foundation in sociological theory. Candidates with specialties that do not overlap with those of existing faculty will have preference. Successful candidates will be prepared to teach Sociological Theory, as well as, courses in their area of interest with the possibility of contributing to the Women's Studies Program and/or the Black Studies Program. The successful applicant will demonstrate excellence in and commitment to student-centered teaching in the liberal arts tradition. Ph.D. (or A.B.D.) in Sociology is required and teaching experience is preferred. Randolph-Macon is a selective, residential liberal arts college located in the beautiful Virginia Piedmont in Ashland, Virginia, 15 miles north of Richmond and 90 miles south of Washington, DC.
