The Department of Sociology and Anthropology at North Carolina State University in Raleigh, NC seeks a teaching post-doc scholar to begin August 16, 2018. The primary purpose of a teaching post doc or visiting assistant professor with a 2/2 teaching load to teach introductory and occasionally more advanced undergraduate courses. The post doc would be offered a 2-year contract, renewable if funding is available. The position includes time for research and learning the scholarship of teaching. In addition to teaching two courses per semester, it is expected that the person attend department faculty meetings and serve as the adviser to the undergraduate Taylor Sociology Club. Ph.D. in Sociology must be awarded no more than five (5) years from initial date of postdoctoral appointment. Successful applicants should demonstrate motivation to teach and mentor undergraduate students, and show evidence of an ability to publish research in their substantive specialty. Ability to teach upper division courses and some experience in teaching introductory courses is preferred.
