

The Department of Sociology and Criminal Justice invites applications for an assistant professor of sociology and criminal justice beginning in August 2019. At the time of appointment, the successful candidate must have a PhD in sociology supplemented by 18 graduate credits in criminal justice or a PhD in criminal justice supplemented by 18 graduate credits in sociology. Do not apply if your highest terminal degree is a juris doctorate or a doctorate in education.

The successful candidate will have the ability to teach introductory level, intermediate, and advanced courses, including but not limited to social statistics, social research, and writing intensive courses in sociology, criminology, and criminal justice. Opportunities may be available to teach graduate and honors college courses in sociology and criminal justice. This position will require teaching face to face and online, and also may require teaching and advising assignments at off-campus satellite programs. Candidates must also serve as a faculty adviser to students and perform administrative tasks as directed by the department chair. The position requires the successful candidate to engage in scholarship including, but not limited to professional publications, conference presentations, and grant acquisition. Expectations for service include participation in department and university-wide committees as well as engagement in community activities relevant to the local community and the region.
