

Virginia Tech invites applications for a full-time, nine-month, non-tenure-track instructor position in the Department of Sociology for the 2019-2020 academic year. Teaching load will be four courses each semester. It is possible that more than one person will be hired. Applicants must have teaching experience in criminology and be able to teach a variety of courses in sociology, criminology and/or peace studies and violence prevention. Applicants must have a minimum of a master's degree in sociology or criminology in hand at the start of appointment. A Ph.D. in one of those fields is preferred.

The Department of Sociology grants the B.S., M.S., and Ph.D. degrees in sociology with options in Africana Studies or Women's and Gender Studies. We also offer an undergraduate major in criminology. The Department of Sociology is the academic home of programs in Africana Studies, American Indian Studies, and Women's and Gender Studies, and houses the Center for Race and Social Policy Research and the Center for Peace Studies and Violence Prevention.
