We seek a sociologist who can teach a variety of courses in the department's sociology major and criminology concentration. Preferred areas of expertise are race, gender, and class inequalities. Candidates should have at least a Master's degree in Sociology with the Ph.D. preferred. The successful candidate will be committed to excellence in teaching and advising. The position involves teaching four courses and advising of undergraduate students. Applications must include cover letter, curriculum vitae, teaching portfolio (including statement of teaching philosophy and student and peer evaluations), and the contact information of three references.
