The Sociology Program within the Department of Sociology, Anthropology and Social Work at Auburn University invites applications for a tenure-track Assistant Professor beginning in August 2020. Faculty with experience at the Assistant Professor level are encouraged to apply. We seek a candidate with specialization in quantitative research methods and statistics, and a secondary area of crime and deviance. Successful candidates will demonstrate ability to conduct scholarly research, publish in peer-reviewed venues, an active, well-articulated research agenda, the potential for external grant funding and a record of excellence in teaching commensurate with years of experience. The ideal candidate will have two years of teaching experience at the assistant professor level and the ability to work collaboratively with colleagues across disciplines. The teaching load is 3/2 across the Sociology curriculum to include undergraduate and graduate courses. The expected teaching assignment is research methods, statistics, courses in crime and deviance, and/or elective courses and also may include introduction to sociology.

Applicants must have a Ph.D. in Sociology at the time of appointment. This is a full-time, 9-month, tenure-track appointment.

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
