The Department of Sociology and Criminology at the University of North Carolina Wilmington is seeking a one-year Visiting Assistant Professor in Sociology for 2020-21. This position carries a teaching load of 4 courses per semester. Candidates must be capable of excellent/dynamic teaching in introductory courses in sociology.

Minimum Requirements

A PhD in sociology or a closely related field is required. ABDs will be considered for the position.

Preferred Qualifications

Previous teaching experience at the undergraduate level, experience in teaching introduction to sociology, social problems, quantitative methods, and online teaching experience is preferred.
